



Where does our food came from? How does it grow? Pollination, bees.












The 7 Elements of Art & Design:

- Line (Thick, thin, dotted, curved, horizontal, zig zag)
- Shape (Organic: shapes found in nature or Geomtric: square, rectangle, circle)
- Colour (Primary, secondary, tertiary, complementary, hot, cold etc)
- Tone (Shading)
- **Texture** (Smooth, rough, sharp)
- Form (3D: height, width, depth)
- Pattern (shapes repeated randomly or organised)



A line's width is sometimes called its "thickness". Lines are sometimes called "strokes", especially when referring to lines in digital artwork.







Hundertwasser - strong use of line, colour, pattern and shape in his work








Sky & Water, 1938. Woodcut.






